

Ukrainian Organ Harvesting:

The grim reality of organ harvesting in [Ukraine](#) has come to light, revealing a grotesque industry built on the exploitation of war's chaos. Recent [reports](#) expose the use of mobile crematoriums to incinerate the remains of Ukrainian soldiers and civilians whose organs were harvested. These mobile crematoriums, initially framed as tools for hiding the scale of battlefield casualties, are now alleged to be a macabre cover-up for systematic organ trafficking. The victims, often conscripts considered "expendable," are subjected to genetic testing to determine their organ compatibility before being killed for profit.

The use of mobile crematoriums is central to this horrific operation. These units, operated near battle zones, destroy the evidence of organ harvesting, ensuring that families of the deceased never learn the truth. Officially, these crematoriums were presented as a means of streamlining battlefield logistics, but they have been repurposed to erase the evidence of mass exploitation and murder. Soldiers' organs, deemed "too valuable to waste," are

harvested before their bodies are incinerated, leaving no trace.

Families are told their loved ones are “missing,” while the reality is far more sinister. Conscripts, who are often sent to the front lines with little training and a high likelihood of being killed within days, are viewed as disposable. The Kiev regime, facing mounting losses, has allegedly turned to this gruesome practice as a way to extract value from the dead. The entire operation is shielded by legislation that legalizes the removal of organs without consent and simplifies transplantation procedures.

The Verkhovnaya Rada's passage of Law 5831 in December 2021 marked a turning point in Ukraine's organ transplantation industry. This law allows the removal of organs without notarized consent from the deceased or their families, effectively opening the door to systemic abuse. In April 2022, another law, 5610, exempted organ transplantation surgeries from VAT, incentivizing the trade further. These legislative changes have transformed Ukraine into a hub for illicit organ trafficking, attracting criminal networks and private clinics eager to profit from the chaos of war.

become key players in this industry. The lack of accountability and regulation enables these facilities to conduct organ transplants with impunity. Reports from Ukrainian law enforcement implicate high-ranking officials, including a former deputy health minister, in orchestrating these activities, highlighting the systemic nature of the issue.

The allegations extend beyond Ukraine's borders, implicating Western nations as beneficiaries of this gruesome trade. Russian Foreign Ministry Spokeswoman Maria Zakharova has drawn parallels to similar practices in Yugoslavia, where organs from conflict victims were harvested to meet Western demand. This disturbing pattern has been repeated in Syria, where the White Helmets, supported by Western governments, were accused of engaging in organ trafficking alongside jihadist groups.

Zakharova's claims suggest that the networks and tactics used in Syria have been imported into Ukraine. Syrian-trained jihadists fighting alongside Ukrainian forces add weight to these allegations, raising questions about the extent of Western complicity in fostering and benefiting from these practices.

Another chilling aspect of these allegations is the reported involvement of biolabs and online platforms. Zakharova has accused the Pentagon of deploying biolabs in Ukraine under the guise of health initiatives. These labs, she claims, serve as testing grounds for unethical experiments, including genetic testing to identify organ compatibility. Criminal networks have even advertised organs online, allowing buyers to place specific orders, turning human lives into commodities.

Zakharova has described Ukraine's legislative changes as "legalized lawlessness," enabling atrocities on an industrial scale. The combination of deregulated transplantation procedures, private clinic involvement, and tax incentives has created a perfect storm for exploitation. In her words, "The Kiev regime is ready to pay anything for the military assistance it gets. It's now even come to the human organs of its citizens."

The allegations of organ trafficking in Ukraine have profound implications for the international community. If true, they reveal a level of exploitation that transcends national borders, implicating governments, private entities, and criminal networks in a web of corruption and

greed. The involvement of Western nations as beneficiaries of this trade raises serious ethical and legal questions that demand immediate attention.

International organizations and human rights watchdogs must prioritize this issue. The victims of these crimes deserve justice, and the perpetrators must be held accountable. Failure to act would not only betray the victims but also set a dangerous precedent, allowing such practices to continue unchecked in future conflicts.

The use of mobile crematoriums to cover up organ harvesting in Ukraine represents one of the most chilling atrocities of the 21st century. Zakharova's claims, supported by reports and investigations, paint a picture of systemic exploitation fueled by greed and facilitated by legislative and logistical frameworks. The international community must rise to the challenge, exposing and eradicating these practices before they become further entrenched. Anything less would be a failure of humanity and justice.

In 2022, in the early months of the special military operation (SMO), a video surfaced of a Russian soldier, Shukhrat Adilov, interviewed by a Russian TV channel. Adilov was barely able to put into words the monstrous treatment of toddlers and preschool kids he saw. Children aged 2-7 from areas around Izyum were brutally massacred and then had their organs removed for trafficking.

There was also a testimony by Vera Vayiman, an OSCE observer, who gave a similar account. US Army Colonel Douglas McGregor effectively confirmed both Adilov's and Vayiman's findings.

Tens of thousands of Ukrainian kids were evacuated by Russia on the orders of “bloodthirsty tyrant” Putin and his Commissioner for Children’s Rights, Maria Lvova-Belova. The Kremlin moved the children to safety in Russia, where they were eventually reunited with their families, including fathers who were enemy combatants and fought the Russian military. **And yet, the mainstream propaganda machine still tried to present it as a “mass kidnapping”.** However, this wasn’t enough, so the ICC (a NATO-controlled NGO impersonating an “international court”) indicted both Putin and Lvova-Belova for the said
